

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT executed at Winnipeg, Manitoba,

as of the twenty-first day of May, 1976.

BETWEEN :

THE CANADIAN COUNCIL OF LAND SURVEYORS,
a body corporate, hereinafter referred
to as "CCLS",

PARTY OF THE FIRST PART

and

THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE OF SURVEYING,
a body corporate, hereinafter referred
to as "CIS",

PARTY OF THE SECOND PART

WITNESSETH THAT WHEREAS :

1. The Canadian Council of Land Surveyors and The Canadian Institute of Surveying must, in the national interest, have the best and most effective means to :
 - 1.1 Maintain and improve their standards of excellence.
 - 1.2 Ensure their full participation in the social and economic development of the country.
 - 1.3 Ensure a rational and effective development of the professions and technical societies to enable them to meet the current and future needs of the country.
 - 1.4 Discharge their responsibility to the public.
 - 1.5 Ensure the development of a truly Canadian Survey identity, body of knowledge, literature, and achievement, in the field of surveying and
 - 1.6 Safeguard their own legitimate interests.
2. These objectives can best be reached by the establishment, maintenance and development of appropriate, coherent and viable Canadian organization working in cooperation and harmony with each other with a minimum of overlap and duplication of effort in order to make the most effective use of the overall human and material resources available and
3. Immediate steps must be taken towards these ends :

NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS :

1. A clear division of responsibilities as per Schedule "A": will be implemented.
2. CCLS will:
 - (a) Encourage all land surveyors to support the CIS in every way possible.
 - (b) otherwise assist in the development and operations of the CIS.
3. The CCLS and CIS will collaborate with the Canadian based technical societies in the organization of technical programs whenever possible.
4. The CIS and its constituent societies will, in recognition of the statutes governing the practice of land surveying in the provinces and territories of Canada, avoid acts or statements which would be in conflict with these statutes.
5. Regular joint meetings of three representatives from each of the CCLS and CIS will be held not less than once per year. At such meetings they shall exchange such information as will promote the purposes of this Agreement.
6. Other means of cooperation and mutual assistance will be developed as required.
7. This Agreement may be amended with the mutual consent of both parties.
8. This Agreement may be terminated by either party after serving one year's notice to the other party.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the Parties hereto have executed this Agreement as of the date first hereinabove written.
